Camp Casey Camper Code of Conduct

We want Camp Casey to be a fun, safe place to spend the week for everyone. In order to do this, we all need to follow certain rules. As a camper, this means your child is expected to:

Participate

- The more you do the more fun you will have.
- Help other campers to have fun at camp events by including and encouraging them.

Respect Others

- Don't take or use others belongings without their permission.
- Cooperate with and follow the requests of the counselors and Kiwanis.
- Be considerate in respecting the privacy of others.
- Keep noise level down while others are sleeping.
- Be in bed before curfew.
- Treat others as you want to be treated.
- Use appropriate language. Do not use rude language or speak badly about other people.
- No hitting, teasing, name calling or inappropriate touching.
- Campers are not allowed in any other barracks except to that which they are assigned.
- If there is a supervised "barracks raid" you must follow the guidelines and rules set out by your barracks captain. If the guidelines are not followed this activity will not be allowed.

Be Safe

- Don't leave camp unless for an approved camp activity or without the supervision of a counselor.
- Always sign out before leaving and sign back in when returning. You must always be part of a group.
- Do not go to an isolated area alone or allow yourself to be taken to an isolated area by anyone.
- Wear your camper identification bracelet the whole time you are in camp.
- Due to allergies, do not bring any latex materials, such as swimming aids, toys or balloons.
- There are a few steep hills or ramps at camp, use caution and, if needed, ask a counselor to assist you.
- Tell a head counselor, Head Nurse or Kiwanis Director if anyone does or says anything that makes you feel uncomfortable.
- With all toileting / restroom activities there should always be two counselors present.
- No prohibited items: fireworks, matches, lighters, flammable liquids, weapons, tobacco, drugs. No smoking. All medications are to be administered by a camp nurse.
